Roan Profile: Kenda Park Lollipop

Lollipop is a 19 year old, chestnut roan, Welsh Mountain mare.

She is a lovely gentle natured mare and a fantastic mum. I bought her in 2018 as a 14 year old broodmare, back in foal to Owendale Sunstone. She had previously had 6 foals for past owners.

Her first foal for me was a lovely palomino roan colt. He has been kept as a stallion. The next to foals have been chestnut colts. She has only had one filly to date.

I had bought her to add to my small group of broodmares and was unaware of any showing history. She has had a few different homes.

In January 2023 I wanted to take 2 roans out to the shows that had added roan classes to their program. Lollipop was in foal and looking fantastic at 18. So, I thought why not take her. Not knowing what to expect when preparing and showing her, I was pleasantly surprised by how well behaved she was. Clearly, she had done this before. Lollipop would have been a lovely show mare back in her day.

One show she was awarded reserve champion roan horse or pony. The highlight though was being placed first in an open breed class, against 3 other very nice mares. Not bad for an 18 year old.

Looking as well as she does, I am sure she will have a few more foals for me. My fingers are crossed for a roan filly.
